WRRC Invites Research Proposals

Faculty and research personnel at any of Arizona's three public universities are invited to submit research proposals to the WRRC for grants of up to \$10,000. Proposals should feature student work and explore new ideas to address water problems in AZ and the Southwest and expand understanding of water and related phenomena. Proposals from a broad range of academic disciplines and professional programs will be considered. Additionally, proposals that increase diversity,



equity, inclusion, and justice, and address issues in historically marginalized or underserved communities are highly encouraged. Last year, the WRRC funded two projects: one that investigated groundwater age distribution and another that looked at the diversity of voices in water resources. These research grants are funded through the



104(b) grants program of the U.S. Geological Survey under the federal Water Resources Research Act. This year's Request for Proposals includes a significant change from previous grant cycles: the cost-sharing requirement was decreased by half from 2:1 to 1:1 local-to-federal match! Proposals are due by 5:00 pm MST on Tuesday, March 1, 2022.

National Climate Assessment Seeks Your Input

The Fifth National Climate Assessment (NCA5) is in development and starting this week, virtual workshops are being held to receive comments on the annotated outline for the report. On February 4, from 10:00 am to 2:30 pm PDT, a



workshop with the authors of chapter on the Southwest will discuss climate changerelated issues that are most important to the region. The NCA is produced by the US Global Change Research Program, a consortium of 13 federal agencies. Every four years, the NCA synthesizes and updates climate knowledge and climate impacts throughout the US. UArizona has a long history of being involved in the NCA, being the home of many authors and lead authors since the beginning of the NCA process in the 1990s. Kathy Jacobs, director of the UArizona Center for Climate Adaptation Science and Solutions (CCASS), was the lead author of the water chapter in the first NCA and director of the third NCA. Gregg Garfin, director of the Arizona Institutes of Resilience (AIR) Southwest Climate Adaptation Science Center, was a convening lead author for the Southwest chapter in the third and fourth NCAs. The third NCA had more authors from UArizona than any other university. Arizona is also well represented in NCA5. Amanda Leinberger, adaptation program manager at CCASS, and Zack Guido, assistant research professor and director of AIR International Programs, are contributing authors for the Caribbean chapter. Additionally, David D. White, director of the Global Institute of Sustainability and Innovation at Arizona State University, is the Southwest Chapter Lead.

ADWR Releases 2021 Arizona Drought Preparedness Report

The Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) has released its 2021 *Arizona Drought Preparedness* report. Since the adoption of the *Arizona Drought Preparedness Plan* in 2004, ADWR publishes this annual report on its implementation. The report summarizes the impact of drought in Arizona during the "water year," which starts October 1 and ends September 30. Despite the strong 2021 monsoon



season, statewide precipitation was below average. The ADWR report summarizes winter and summer precipitation and provides a record of the state's water supplies. Additionally, the report is a record of landmark events like the Colorado River shortage declaration and the actions the state has taken to prepare for continuing drought.
