

February 14 is an important date for me – and not only because it is Valentine's Day and Arizona Statehood Day. February 14 is also the anniversary date of my joining the Water Resources Research Center and Arizona Cooperative Extension faculty. This year marks 20 years! How did statehood day come to be my work anniversary? There is a story to

that. As has occurred over the years, state budget considerations were causing the University of Arizona to tighten its belt and look carefully at its hiring. Eugene Sander, then Dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, was key to my returning to the University of Arizona. He and then WRRC Director Peter Wierenga were in negotiations with me when, in late January 2002, Dean Sander asked, "How soon can you start?" There was some worry of a hiring freeze. It did not take me long to identify Arizona Statehood Day as a fitting day to return to the University of Arizona, and I joined the WRRC as Associate Director on February 14, 2002. (I became WRRC Director on July 1, 2004.) Twenty years later, I am truly grateful for the opportunity to get to know the many individuals and communities, broadly construed, with whom I have worked over the years to foster understanding of the critical water issues faced by Arizona and other semi-arid regions and explore pathways to address them.



Brown Bag Webinar Explores the Future of Water Management in Southern Nevada

On Tuesday, Deputy General Manager of Resources for Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) Colby Pellegrino gave a talk in another installment of the WRRC's Brown Bag Webinar series. Pellegrino explained her role with SNWA, and the role that SNWA plays in Nevada, managing the Colorado River water allocation for



the driest state and driest metropolitan area in the country. Over 90% of the water used in Southern Nevada comes from the Colorado River. Decades of drought, the growing effects of climate change, and a booming population have required SNWA to implement new technologies and policies to avoid running out of water. Pellegrino discussed SNWA operations, as well as the history of the organization and its responses to drought since the 2000s. She emphasized their proactive approach to water management and provided an overview of the multitude of methods used to promote water conservation. Now, as Colorado River Basin states face historic shortage declarations and water levels in Lake Mead continue to drop, this proactive approach has prompted SNWA to develop new strategies for water conservation to address the new reality.



With their support and assistance, APW was able to get students back to attending outdoor field trips after a long hiatus and provided some hands-on educational water fun.

Recently Published White Paper Addresses US-Mexico Cooperation on Water

The white paper, "Water Management on the U.S.-Mexico Border: Achieving Water Sustainability and Resilience Through Cross-Border Cooperation" is posted on our updated Transboundary Aquifer Assessment Program website.

The United States International Boundary and Water Commission (USIBWC) invited a group of researchers to write a white paper to help strengthen its "ability to respond to the



challenges of US-Mexico border water management in the 21st century." The paper, "Water Management on the U.S.-Mexico Border: Achieving Water Sustainability and Resilience Through Cross-Border Cooperation," is organized into three main sections: 1) institutional context; 2) US-Mexico border water management challenges and opportunities in the 21st century, and 3) institutional and policy needs. The paper notes that population and economic growth require a steady water supply, which border cities will likely struggle to secure, and that it is critical to incorporate future climate scenarios in future agreements while also considering environmental justice concerns.

Sophia Borgias Receives UCOWR PhD Dissertation Award

Congratulations to Dr. Sophia Borgias, recipient of the UCOWR 2022 PhD Dissertation Award in the Water Policy & Economics category, on her paper "Public Interest, Indigenous Rights, and the Los Angeles Aqueduct." Dr. Borgias received her PhD and MA in Geography from the UArizona under the guidance of Dr. Carl Bauer. Borgias' research examines the legal and political



dimensions of water and has investigated the social response to large-scale hydropower

development in central and southern Chile. The focus of her dissertation, for which she earned this award, centered on the ongoing conflict over the City of Los Angeles' control of land and water resources in Owens Valley. On April 7, WRRC will host a Brown Bag webinar featuring Dr. Borgias that will discuss her award-winning research, as well as her current "collaborative research about Indigenous land and water rights in Payahuunadü, the Nüümü/Newe territory encompassing the Owens and Mono basins in eastern California."
