Special Edition of the Arroyo Released

The WRRC and the International Arid Lands Consortium (IALC) have published a Special Edition of the *Arroyo: Addressing Environmental Challenges of Arid Lands*. The publication of this Special Edition represents the final activity of the IALC, an independent consortium of institutions dedicated to promoting "cooperation, education, and technology transfer to address issues facing the world's drylands." Marking 30 years of collaboration on issues affecting arid and semiarid regions, the IALC hosted a three-day conference in May 2021 to underscore its mission. The Special Edition *Arroyo* summarizes the presentations and discussions of the conference and highlights the IALC's Call to Action published in the Conference Declaration. Honorary Chair Joe Hess concluded the

conference commemorating the sunsetting of the IALC: "We therefore pass the baton to other consortiums, government agencies and universities to carry on this important endeavor that affects the well-being of all mankind and brings peace between nations."

Exciting and Full Schedule of Spring Events

Somehow, we are already at the threshold of Spring Break at UArizona. As we enter the second half of the semester, the WRRC looks forward to an exciting lineup of Brown Bag webinars and special events. March 14 is the next installment of the <u>Native Voices in STEM</u> (NVIS) seminar series, which focuses on wastewater epidemiology in Tribal communities, and is organized by UArizona Indige-FEWSS and several other



UArizona departments and units, including the WRRC. On World Water Day (March 22), the WRRC will participate in a virtual "Teach-In" hosted by Pima County District 5. In collaboration with the Colorado Water Center at Colorado State University, the WRRC will host Looking Upstream: An Upper Basin Perspective on March 29. Join us for a panel moderated by Colorado Water Center Interim Director and Senior Water Policy Scholar Jennifer Gimbel, with speakers Jim Lochhead, CEO/Manager of Denver Water and Steve Wolff, General Manager of the Southwestern Water Conservation District. Then, kicking off events in April, the WRRC is co-sponsoring a Udall Center Workshop on green infrastructure research on April 6. On April 7, we will welcome Sofia Borgias, assistant professor at Boise State University for a presentation titled Public Interest, Indigenous Rights, and the Los Angeles Aqueduct. The final seminar of the NVIS series will be held April 11 with Dr. Tommy Rock presenting on Environmental Justice. Carlos A. de la Parra, Chair of the Board, Restauremos el Colorado, AC, will speak on civil society in the binational agreements on the Colorado River on April 19, and on April 27, Sharon Napier, National Program Leader for Water Reuse at the EPA Office of Water will speak on the programs of her office. In the afternoon of May 3, Jim Enote, CEO of the Colorado Plateau Foundation will discuss Counter Mapping, an effort to create maps that bring an

Indigenous voice and perspective back to the land, countering Western notions of place and geography.



Upcoming WRRC and Collaborative Events

Integrating Water Management and Land Use

Despite overlapping mandates, land use and water management agencies are typically separate. The Lincoln Institute of Land Policy's newest policy focus report from the Babbitt Center for Land and Water Policy investigates how uniting land and water planning is necessary to address the challenges posed by climate change, population growth, and drought. In *Integrating Land Use and Water Management,* author Erin Rugland, Program Manager, Babbitt Center for Land and Water Policy, outlines best practices in water management and land use planning and provides policy



tools that can be used for their integration. The report features four success stories from across the US, including Colorado, Florida, Philadelphia, and Minnesota. According to the report, state policy is crucial to integrating land and water planning, and Rugland provides four recommendations for policymakers to accomplish integration goals. Among her recommendations are state mandates, building capacity through funding and technical assistance, collaborating locally, and coordinating regional expertise and oversight.

Sustainability Fund Grant Application Now Open

The UArizona Office of Sustainability Campus Sustainability Fund (CSF) is accepting applications for its inaugural annual grant program. Awards range between \$5,000 and \$100,000 and will be allocated in July. Funded projects must be completed by June 2023. CSF projects enable students to have a direct impact on sustainability on the UArizona campus while also gaining



project management experience. The fund is seeking diverse proposals that focus on waste reduction, energy use, social sustainability, and other efforts to promote and further the University's goals. Grant applications are due by 5 pm on March 31. The Campus Sustainability Fund works to create a more sustainable future for UArizona, built by students and campus community members. CSF also offers Mini-Grants for small-scale short projects, in addition to the Annual Grants for larger projects. The CSF is funded through the Sustainability Fee and has project-specific funding from the Agnese Nelms Haury Program and an anonymous donor. The CSF was created as the successor to the UArizona Green Fund, which funded projects around campus for more tha a decade, including the WRRC's rainwater harvesting system.
