

On World Water Day, 2019, I published my first *Reflections* essay. The United Nations established March 22 as World Water Day in 1993 to raise awareness of global water challenges, including lack of access to water and sanitation. My introduction to World Water Day was in 2013, when after attending an international groundwater meeting in the Netherlands, I had the privilege of participating on the program of a major international gathering in The Hague celebrating World Water Day. The theme that year was

International Water Cooperation. Subsequent themes have been Water and Energy, Water and Sustainable Development, Better Water, Better Jobs, Why Waste Water?, Nature for Water, Leaving No One Behind, Water and Climate Change, and Valuing Water.



## **New Water Agency May Be On the Horizon**

Arizona Governor Doug Ducey recently announced a plan to create a new water agency: the Arizona Water Authority. Draft legislation that would implement his plan has been distributed to lawmakers. The Authority would focus primarily on finding new water supplies, building new infrastructure, and funding projects like desalination in the Sea of Cortez. The state Legislature may



hold a special session to consider the bill. If established, the agency would significantly expand the state's involvement in water, allowing the state to obtain and market water rights. The Arizona Department of Water Resources, however, would remain the primary regulator and manager of water in the state. The Authority would manage two funds: the Water Supply Development Revolving Fund, with a focus on projects in rural counties, and the Long-term Water Augmentation Fund, which would make loans available for entities working on water augmentation or conservation projects anywhere within or outside the state.

# New Recharge & Recovery Workgroup Being Formed

The Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) is forming a new workgroup for Recharge & Recovery on behalf of the **Governor's Water Augmentation, Innovation, and Conservation Council**. Responding to stakeholder concerns regarding the Recharge & Recovery Program and a recent **recommendation** by the Post-2025 Active Management



Areas (AMAs) Committee, ADWR is inviting public participation in the new workgroup. As a forum for stakeholder feedback, the workgroup will discuss the program framework, including statutes, rules, management plan requirements, and substantive policy. ADWR plans a series of three initial meetings to establish a consistent foundation of understanding through educational content and informal discussions. Tentative workgroup meeting dates are Thursdays, April 14, May 12, and June 16, 2022. Additional meetings will be planned as needed. An **online survey** will help inform preparations for workgroup meetings. The survey is collecting comments on the question: What topic or topics

regarding the recharge and recovery requirements would benefit from further clarification or explanation? The survey closes on March 21. Send questions/comments to Jenna Norris at <a href="mailto:jnorris@azwater.gov">jnorris@azwater.gov</a>.

## Special Notice: WRRC Funding Included in Omnibus Bill

The FY2022 Omnibus bill recently signed into law includes funding important to the WRRC. The package included \$14 million (an increase from \$11 million in FY 2021) for the Water Resources Research Act (WRRA) program. WRRA funding supports 54 Water Resources Research Institutes, including the WRRC! The package also appropriated \$1 million for the US-Mexico Transboundary Aquifer Assessment Program (TAAP). The TAAP-A/S (transboundary Santa Cruz and San Pedro aquifers) is a federally funded program co-hosted by the USGS Arizona Water Science Center and the WRRC.
