# WRRC Brown Bag: The Role of NGOs in International Colorado River Policy

On Tuesday, the WRRC hosted a Brown Bag Webinar, *Civil Society in the Binational Agreements of the Colorado River:*Advocacy Meets Shuttle Diplomacy, featuring speaker Carlos de la Parra. In his presentation, de la Parra discussed the role of Nongovernmental Organizations (NGOs) in both the US and Mexico



and the Treaty on International Waters, which governs water policy between the two countries. De la Parra began his presentation by explaining some of the history of NGOs in Mexico and his own experiences with civil society in the water sector. He explored past, current, and possible future work of NGOs and the impacts that they can have in the agricultural water world. He emphasized the difficulty and importance of engaging with local agricultural communities in places like Mexicali with the goal of improving water efficiency. NGOs have developed enough rapport with local farmers to hold workshops on topics like land fallowing and crop conversion, which will lead to additional water savings that can be returned to the environment for ecological restoration. After his talk, de la Parra engaged in a Q&A with the audience on the role of civil society in border water policy.

# New Reclamation Map Highlights Sovereign Nations

The United States Bureau of Reclamation has distributed an updated map depicting the full extent of the Colorado River Basin (CRB), from western Wyoming to Sonora, Mexico; and within the basin's boundaries, all thirty federally recognized Tribal Nations. Titled Federally Recognized Tribes in the Colorado River Basin, this map highlights the inter-governmental nature of water resources management in the CRB. The WRRC, through our



Indigenous Water Dialogues Initiative, works to highlight the role of sovereign Tribal Nations in water resources. This map is significant in this work because it, like all maps, tells a story that can have an impact on decision-making. A map's power to deepen our understanding and expand our curiosity comes not only from what it includes but what is left out. When new choices are made, the story changes. This updated view of the CRB will help tell the evolving story of water in the southwestern United States. The upcoming WRRC Special Event, Counter Mapping Articulates What Is Between (May 2 at 3:00 pm), will delve into the power of maps.

## Online Puzzle Game Educates About Groundwater

A collaboration between the International Water Resources Association and the University of Massachusetts Amherst produced an online puzzle game that educates players about



groundwater. The game is like a digital escape room. The objective is to solve a multi-step puzzle to help the player's "Aunt Darcy." It is accessible to anyone; all you need is a computer with internet access and a notepad to keep track of clues. In order to solve the puzzle, players must read through hydrogeologist Aunt Darcy's books, files, and notes,

learning about topics like well drilling, transboundary aquifers, salinity, nitrate leaching, and hydraulic conductivity. While reading, it's important to keep an eye out for clues, which may be words, numbers, or symbols of special significance. While a few hints are provided to help, the player must find all of the clues to save the day! When put together in the correct order, the clues allow players to solve the puzzle and win the game. This game is designed for those who are unfamiliar with groundwater issues, but also enjoyable for groundwater experts who just want to have some fun!
