







23rd Annual Law of the Colorado River Conference

The Water Law Institute's annual Law of the Colorado River Conference is back in person this year. The conference will be held May 19-20 in Santa Fe, NM. This year marks the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Colorado River Compact. The two-day conference will feature experts from around the West and numerous backgrounds. The featured presentation, "New



Mexico Perspectives on the Compact," will be presented on May 19 by speakers Mike Hamman, New Mexico State Engineer, Estevan Lopez, Commissioner for New Mexico on the Upper Colorado River Commission, and Rolf Schmidt-Petersen, Director of the New Mexico Interstate Stream Commission. The conference will focus on the past, present, and future of the Colorado River Compact and will feature speakers from various perspectives on the issue.

ADWR Chief Attorney Ken Slowinski Honored

Ken Slowinski, chief legal counsel to the Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR), was honored on April 6 with the Michael J. Brophy Distinguished Service Award. Conferred by the Environmental and Natural Resources Law Section of the State Bar of Arizona, this award acknowledges exceptional attorneys in the field of environmental and water law. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Ken Slowinski's award ceremony was



delayed; the Arizona Bar announced his selection in January 2020, but the conferral and celebratory dinner were postponed until this year. Several of Slowinski's colleagues spoke at the event, recognizing him for his outstanding work and the universal respect he has earned in his field. ADWR Director Tom Buschatzke could not attend the event, but emphasized in a video recording that Slowinski "is the embodiment of each and every one" of the essential qualities of Brophy Award recipients: honesty, integrity, courage, and compassion. For the past 33 years, Slowinski has worked for ADWR as a public servant, advocating for Arizona's water future. He has announced his plan to retire this summer. The WRRC thanks him for his service to the state and for his willingness to share some of his expertise over the years.
