WRRC Hosts USGS National Leadership Meeting

On December 5-7 the WRRC hosted personnel from the United States Geological Survey (USGS) Office of Planning and Programming for a series of meetings. during which WRRC Director Sharon Megdal was given the opportunity to showcase the WRRC's mission and programs. The meeting also included an overview of the Transboundary Aguifer Assessment Program (TAAP). Dr.



Sam Fernald, Director of the New Mexico Water Resources Research Institute, led a discussion of collaborative efforts of the members of the National Institutes for Water Resources (NIWR). The 54 NIWR institutes and university research projects are funded by the USGS through Annual Base Grants, National Competitive Grants, and Coordination Grants. In addition, students are supported through the NIWR-USGS Student Internship Program. The group also attended a brownbag lecture on December 6th given by Meghan Smart of the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality.

Inspired by this experience, the students are building frame prototypes to scale, soldering circuit boards, and assembling motors. And in the process, they are building life skills and interest in STEM careers - something we can already see!


