conversion of a water right refers to change in the nature of use at the same location

diverted taken from a river or stream through a diversion structure

eminent domain power of government to take private property for a public purpose

exempt well a well having a pump with a maximum capacity of not more than thirty-five

gallons per minute which is used to withdraw groundwater in an AMA

extinguished terminated; made an end to a water right

junior lower priority of water right because created more recently

MVIDD Mohave Valley Irrigation and Drainage District

perfected a water right is perfected when all necessary legal steps for acquiring the right

have been completed

reasonable use usually considered synonymous with beneficial use

renewable continuously or regularly replaced, such as surface water; not exhaustible

SCIDD San Carlos Irrigation and Drainage District

sever and transfer act or process of separating a water right from the land to which it is

appurtenant and moving it to another location
